My dear friends in the Muslim community,

Allow me this opportunity to express my sincere hope that the celebration of Id al-Fitr, as observed last month, was a joyous time for you. In the midst of life's daily challenges, it is indeed important to take time to give thanks to God and to enjoy the company of family and friends.

With this letter I am pleased to enclose Holy See's annual message to Muslims as was issued for the end of Ramadan. I would be pleased if you are able to share my greetings and the message from the Holy See with the members of your congregation.

The theme of this year's message, "Christians and Muslims: Together in overcoming poverty", is timely and fitting. I well recall that when our local interreligious leadership group met last spring, we spoke of our shared desire to alleviate the hardships experienced by the poor.
