



CatholicTV to air Solemn Vespers and Installation liturgies of New York Archbishop Timothy Dolan. Cardinal Sean O'Malley will be present for this important occasion.

Watertown MA-This week, *CatholicTV* and *CatholicTV.com* will feature Solemn Vespers and the Mass of Installation of the Most Reverend Timothy M. Dolan, as the tenth Archbishop of the Archdiocese of New York from St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York City.

Timothy Michael Dolan was named Archbishop of New York by Pope Benedict XVI on February 23, 2009. He will be installed as Archbishop of New York on April 15, 2009. Archbishop Dolan will be received during Solemn Vespers at the Cathedral of Saint Patrick on Tuesday April 14th; this prayer service will air on **CatholicTV** at 8PM. The installation of the Most Reverend Timothy M. Dolan as the tenth archbishop of the Archdiocese of New York will air live on *CatholicTV* at 1:30PM and will rebroadcast that same evening.

The reception at Solemn Vespers takes place on the eve of the Mass of Installation. In a significant gesture the Archbishop will knock on the door of the St. Patrick's Cathedral to be welcomed as pastor of that iconic church and shepherd of the Archdiocese of New York.

In June of this year the Archbishop will receive his pallium, the symbolic garment from His Holiness, Pope Benedict XVI. The pallium is an ecclesiastical vestment which represents an archbishop's ecclesial and pastoral authority, in union with the pope, over the metropolitan province that has been entrusted to his care.

The Archdiocese of New York, along with the (arch)dioceses of Boston, Philadelphia and Louisville, celebrated 200 years in the year 2008. There are over 400 parishes in the Archdiocese of New York which is the metropolitan see of the ecclesiastical province of New York which includes the following suffragan dioceses: Brooklyn, Albany, Buffalo, Syracuse, Rochester, Ogdensburg, and Rockville Centre .
