
## INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

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## Notes to Financial Statements

June 30, 2006

### Note 1 - The Trust

The Benefit Trust for Non-Incardinated Priests Duly Assigned for Service in the Archdiocese of Boston ("the Trust") was established for the purpose of providing benefits for covered priests, as directed by the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Boston. It is the intent of the Trust that all funds received and held by the Trustee shall be exclusively allocated for the support and well-being of priests who were not incardinated in the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Boston, but who have been duly assigned by the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Boston for service within the Archdiocese. The Trust is not subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

### Note 2 - Significant Accounting Policies

Accounting Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Cash and Cash Equivalents - The Trust deposits its cash in major financial institutions, which are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation ("FDIC") up to \$ 100,000. There have been no uninsured deposits. Cash equivalents consist of uninsured money market mutual funds approximating \$294 at June 30, 2006 (\$284 at June 30, 2005).

The Trust has not experienced any losses as a result of the use of uninsured amounts.

Basis of Accounting - The financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

### Note 3 –Related Party Transactions

Funds generated from the annual parish collections designated for the support of priests in the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Boston are contributed to the Trust as needed. During the year ended June 30, 2006, \$ 100,510 was received from these collections (\$50,072 in 2005).

During the year ended June 30, 2004, the Trust received \$50,000 from the Archdiocese of Boston Clergy Benefit Trust (a related organization) and \$75,000 from the Archdiocese of Boston Clergy Retirement/Disability Plan (a related organization).
